

## COVID Protocols: Summer 2021

All summer programs bringing visitors to TCU must abide by these requirements:

- Groups must abide by current campus protocol found at [TCU Connected Campus](#).
- All spaces have reduced capacities to account for six feet of social distancing. Group reservations are required to maintain 6-ft social distancing for all activities.
- If a participant [exhibits symptoms of COVID](#), the program organizer must arrange a test for the participant. The nearest testing center is University Urgent Care on Berry St.
- If a participant tests positive for COVID:
  - The COVID-positive participant and any close contacts must be removed from the camp/program immediately.
  - A family member or guardian must pick up a COVID-positive camper.
  - The program organizer must notify TCU immediately on the TCU Campus Visitors Self-Report form.
  - The program organizer must conduct contact tracing for anyone in close contact with the COVID-positive participant up to 48 hours prior to symptom onset.
    - ***Close contact is broadly defined as being within 6-feet for at least 15 minutes over the course of the day. If close contact cannot be determined or if you are unsure, list all potential close contacts. Please include all campus and community members who had close contact and could have been exposed.***
  - Close contacts may not participate in the camp.
- Programs must provide at least two more Authorized Adults than required for the 15:1 camper:chaperone ratio, to account for the possibility that an Authorized Adult tests positive for COVID during the program and for accompanying minors who may test positive.

Additional guidelines and recommendations:

- Participants should test themselves daily at home before leaving for camp.
- Participants who feel sick or exhibit symptoms should stay home and not attend camp.
- Program organizers should promote healthy hygiene practices such as frequent hand-washing.
